Coming out is not a universal, one-time event that has a clear start and end point. It is an individual, ongoing, life-long process that has layers and levels. This workshop takes an intersectional look at the benefits, risks and fears commonly associated with be-coming out. We will explore how intersectionality impacts safety, level of outness and the layers involved in the process. We will highlight common needs, feelings, tasks, challenges and triumphs. You will leave with tools that you can use to support yourself or someone you love in be-coming out.
