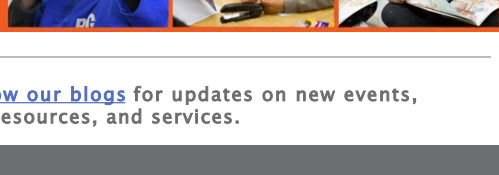


Movie Streaming: **Knightriders**

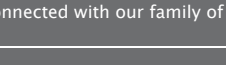
