Where meditation and verse come to life

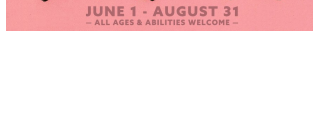
Dear Community,

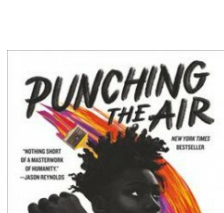

A child and parent journey through life together--always remembering that even if the other is far away, they can meet in their dreams.

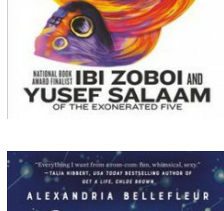

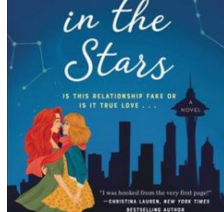
